This Michigan Master Composter class is offered by Project Grow and Washtenaw County through the Ann Arbor Public Schools Rec & Ed program. Discover the basics of home composting in this fun class taught by Master Composters and local landscape and composting professionals eager to share their experience with you. After attending this course, passing the open book exam, and clocking 10 hours of hands-on community volunteer experience, you will become a certified Washtenaw County Master Composter. This program is coordinated by Project Grow and is designed for the general public and for Master Gardeners to continue their organic gardening education.
