Wet weather prevented garden tilling until May 12th this year. The only exception was County Farm which was tilled two weeks earlier. Site coordinators and volunteers quickly staked all the gardens and they were all open a day or two after being tilled.

2022 Plant Sale

Our plant sale was this year was very successful!. Like all things in the garden, every year we experience problems we have never seen before and this year was no exception. A large number of our tomato seedlings damped off and we needed to re-sow everything about 10 days later.

This forced us to delay the sale but, mid-May is a better time for a sale of mostly tender plants anyway. We plan for future sales to always be after Mother's Day, rather than the day before.

Putting labels in all the 3" pots.

Filling advance orders.

Preparing for the sale, setting up shelving, and then plants and signs on the shelves.

Helping with advance order pickup at Dawn Farm.

Assisting shoppers at Dawn Farm during the sale.

Clean up after the sale.

Thursday June 2nd

How do you protect your garden from all the creatures large and small that want to share in your harvest? Find out who they are and what you can do to control them without resorting to pesticides. The four strategies of Integrated Pest Control - cultural, physical, biological, and chemical will be discussed in detail.
